Mission Statement

HAMS supports every positive change. The focus of HAMS is alcohol harm reduction, but users of any substance are welcome. HAMS offers support via live and online groups and offers information via the web and printed page. HAMS support groups are lay-led and free-of charge.

The HAMS book, <u>How to Change Your Drinking: a Harm Reduction Guide to Alcohol</u>, is available in 40 libraries worldwide as of this writing (2/7/2013). It has been cited in Patt Denning's book <u>Practicing Harm Reduction Psychotherapy</u>, <u>Second Edition</u> and Paula DeSanto's <u>Effective Addiction Treatment</u>.

Giving away review copies of the HAMS book to addiction treatment professionals, therapists, college professors, and others who can recommend it to people has proven a great strategy for getting out the word about HAMS and increasing sales of the book to those who can benefit from it. LinkedIn and the internet in general have been great avenues for finding people interested in alcohol harm reduction, so have the harm reduction conferences and contacts made with local harm reduction agencies.

HAMS brought the book out on Nook in December, removing it from KOLL at this time in accordance with Amazon's guidelines.

The following chart illustrates the sales of the HAMS book graphically; KOLL stands for Kindle Owners Lending Library. The sales spike in late 2011 was due to putting the kindle edition on a 99 cent sale for a couple of months.




University Presentations

Support Groups

HAMS offers both live and online support groups. Currently HAMS has one <u>live meeting in</u> <u>Brooklyn, New York</u> and another in Paducah Kentucky. The <u>HAMS email group</u> has 979 members as of this writing (2/8/2013). HAMS has <u>real-time online chats</u> every evening at 9 PM Eastern Time. Chats are lively with often six or ten chatters at a time. HAMS also offers a <u>drugs</u> <u>harm reduction email group</u>, a <u>CATS cannabis substitution email group</u>, and <u>HARM-LESS</u>, an <u>Al-Anon Alternative</u>. Complete separation of the finances of the corporation and the founder was finally attained; the founder was put on payroll with a salary of \$300 (three hundred dollars) per month starting June 1, 2012. HAMS is now self-supporting through book sales and donations and is no longer run out of the back pocket of the founder.

Executive Director Kenneth Anderson is currently studying nonprofit management and development best practices and harm reduction best practices at the Lower East Side Harm Reduction Center and will by applying these to HAMS in the coming year and beyond.
