

The HAMS Book

From publication 6/10/10 to 12/31/13 the HAMS book, <u>How to Change Your Drinking: a Harm</u> <u>Reduction Guide to Alcohol</u>, has sold 8341 copies--we count KOLL (Kindle owner lending library) lends as sales since each lend pays a royalty between two and three dollars. Sales figures are summarized in the charts below:

HAMS also ran two Amazon free eBook promotions in 2013 resulting in a total of 1537 kindle editions being given away over a total of five days. Although this temporarily improved search rank it had little net value in the long term.

The HAMS book consistently outsells all other books on controlled drinking on Amazon and is available in $\frac{42 \text{ libraries}}{42 \text{ libraries}}$ worldwide.

HAMS Web Site

The HAMS web site has a totally revamped <u>home page</u> to reflect our philosophy visually and a new <u>flash chat room</u> to avoid the security problems found with Java chat. 


We did not have as many listens this past year as the previous year because time constraints prevented us from doing a show every single week.




Email Groups




A total of 38,950 emails were sent on the email group between its founding on 01/15/2007 and 12/31/2013. The following two charts show emails per year and pr month:






The HAMS abstainers Yahoo group currently has 29 members and has grown active again. The following chart shows messaging activity from its founding 3/6/09 to 12/31/13:




Other HAMS subgroups are currently inactive.

HAMS Chat


Fiscal


